
The board has voted to continue its support of the German language programs at Tulsa Community College and the University of Tulsa.

The Board of the German American Society of Tulsa has authorized GAST to participate with Junior League of Tulsa (a local service organization) and several other local organizations in a joint project for this spring to celebrate the International Year of the Volunteer.

The project chosen will provide small duffel bags with personal care items for children from ages two to ten who live in shelters, foster homes or other agencies and who do not have even basic necessities. Our Board has voted to purchase toothbrushes and toothpaste for the duffel bags.

However, we offer anyone who would like to participate, the opportunity to help with the **project**. You can do this by bringing a small teddy bear or other small stuffed animal to the GAST Spring party on April 21st.



The duffel bags will be assembled on April 28th. We are hoping to be able to present not only toothbrushes and toothpaste for 225 children but 225 stuffed animals as well. By including a toy, we hope to bring a little joy and comfort into the life of a child at a

time when he or she experiences loss and an unknown future.
