







Progress Report on Stan Conrad

To all of Stan and Barbara's friends, I spoke to Barbara last night, 11 PM German time. Stanley was scheduled to be operated at 3 PM as the last surgery of the day. Nevertheless, she had just heard from the Surgeon who performed the operation. The operation went well, however the surgeon told Barbara that the tumor was larger then expected and that it was probably an older tumor that had been growing for some time.

The good news is that liver and lungs are still unaffected but the surgeon was concerned about tiny lymph knots visible in the surrounding area. He could not give Barbara a more specific diagnosis and said they have to wait for the pathology report which will take almost a week before it is completed. He did say that Stanley would have to undergo Chemo therapy.

When I spoke to Stanley yesterday morning before the surgery, he asked me to tell you how touched he was by the many, many loving cards and letters of support and well wishes he had received from his friends here in Tulsa. He wishes to thank each and everyone and asked that we keep him in our prayers. Barbara said that although all is still very uncertain, they are planning to return in late August.

A little Cookbook History

About fourteen years ago, when I joined GAST, I heard that various members had tried, unsuccessfully, to put together a GAST cookbook. As I began to run out of storage, I asked my secretary to make some room deleting all at my tour company data from the system. Then it happened. Everything got deleted, including my recipes. My dream of being able to single-handedly produce our cookbook was gone. That's when I asked other members to give me a hand entering recipes into the format we had utilized.

Needless to say, not unlike the experience reported by Irmgard Toschik in last month's ECHO, I got very few volunteers. As a result, I allowed the project to go dormant. Recently, Irmgard asked if she could help with the cookbook, since she had the time and interest. Naturally, I said "yes" and gave her the entire hard-copy file. Since I had started this, I plan to stay on the project editorially. Irmgard is progressing with the entries, but still needs more authentic recipes. Please help!
