

News in Arts

2001 was a busy year for **GAST** and **ARTS**. Thanks to the hard work of our committees, volunteers and generous contributors, we were able to sponsor a number of cultural events for the enjoyment of our membership and the general public, starting with the Rose Stone Trio ("Wine and Roses") in February, which was supported by the Oklahoma Arts Council. Another musical trio, KOLORIT from Sachsen-Anhalt, honored us with a return visit in April. In August the American Theatre Organ Society held a miniconcert in our Great Hall.

Then came the September attack on New York and Washington, crippling air traffic and readying our nation for war against terrorism. Our plans to feature the Jagdhornbläser-corps from Celle/Germany for German-American Day seemed in jeopardy. But our visitors were undeterred and became a shining example of Germany's support of the United States. Not only did they perform for us at German-American Day on October 7, but they also delighted hundreds of children and adults with their unique instruments at area schools, a church, a restaurant, and on Bartlett Square. We are grateful for the support from the Tulsa Celle Sister City Partnership.

Another example of international cooperation in the arts was the Classical Flute Concert we enjoyed on November 11. A referral by the Dallas Goethe Center and sponsorship by PRO HELVETIA and the Foundation for the Promotion of the Performing Arts, Zurich/Switzerland and support by

the Swiss Club of Oklahoma made that event possible.

Our annual interdenominational Adventsfeier on December 9th was arranged by **Barbara Conrad** and assisted by Ursula Andress. Retired Pastor Heinrich Oelze who worships at the Paul Gerhardt Gemeinde in Hannover/Germany and works with a German-Russian church in Perm/Russia lead the all German service which included our favorite Christmas carols sung by the **GASTSÄNGER** Choir under the direction of **Leon Boggs** who also played the organ. The congregation enjoyed a beautiful solo by **Hannelore** Hall ("Maria durch den Dornwald ging"). She was accompanied by Theresa Wehmeyer on the piano. All contributions collected this day will be donated to Meals on Wheels. Pastor Oelze also gave an interesting report on Monday, December 10, about the rebuilding of the German-Russian congregation and the renovation of the church building and grounds. It was obvious that much work still needs to be done.

I would like to thank all of the members and friends who contributed their time and money to the GAST ARTS ASSOCIATION in 2001. You made it possible to bring the above mentioned cultural events to our city. Let's work together to make 2002 another successful year.

Notes from our Pubmeister

I provided the first monthly statement of Bar financials to the board in December 1992. Since then we have used the bar seventy-six times. The calculations are all running totals. Initially the bar showed a decided Plus in donations. I slowly improved the quality of our beverages in an attempt to increase member satisfaction, yet still hoping to break even. This was achieved during 1998.

Since reaching this point, donations have slowly dropped off. As of the close of 1999 donations averaged minus \$7 per event. At the close of 2000, they averaged minus \$9 per event. Now, at the end of 2001 they have averaged minus \$13 per event. Interestingly, Oktoberfest donations are among the best, while January's are the poorest!



Having served as bartender for almost every event, I have observed that members fail to inform guests and new members of our donation policy. As a result, there are many, who feel the drinks are free and the donation-boot serves to gather tips for bar personnel.

Not so! We ask again that our members need to inform guests and new members of our policy at the bar.

All monies donated at the bar are deposited directly to GAST to defray the cost of purchasing our quality beverages and snacks.


