The President's Report to the Membership



A Plea for Help

In the present and in many past editions of the ECHO, you have seen my name many times functioning as a member of the GAST Board. However, this time please let me address you as **Barbara Conrad**, concerned citizen.

Many of you were at the Advent service conducted by Pastor Oelze from Hanover. Pastor Oelze is a retired Lutheran minister who since 1995 has been very much involved in helping with both the spiritual and material needs of a small community of Russian Germans in Perm, Russia. Perm is a dingy industrial town of over one million people situated at the foothills of the Ural Mountains and was the gateway used by various Soviet leaders to send people to Siberia.

This small German community is what is left of thousands of Germans deported by Stalin primarily from the fertile Volga river area. They are in need of just about anything that you can imagine. The German Government and congregations in Germany and Austria are helping some. There is a nearby German Catholic Church which is also trying to revive a little bit of Germany in the middle of Russia.

Needless to say these two congregations cooperate closely for the common good of all. Stan and I have attended services in Perm and have contributed to the ongoing church renovation. The labor is done mostly by members but nevertheless requires the purchase of supplies. You would be amazed at how appreciative these poor people are for help of any sort. Before the end of the cold war, they made great sacrifices and were in grave danger to keep their culture, language and spiritual beliefs alive. We found the entire experience to be deeply moving and satisfying.
