Please join us for this important celebration. We are fortunate to have German-born author, **Wolf-gang Samuel** as our keynote speaker. Mr. Samuel immigrated to the States as a teenager, later joined the U.S. Air Force and, after 30 years of service retired with the rank of Colonel.

He is the author of three most fascinating books. His first book, "German Boy", tells of his own experiences as a child in war-torn Germany. In his second book, entitled: "I always Wanted to Fly", he relates the harrowing experiences of our "cold-war Air Force heroes". (If you're aviation-or-militaryminded, you will want to read this book). For his the third book, "The War of our Childhood", the author interviewed a number of individuals who, as children, had lived in Germany through the final years of the war and its immediate aftereffects. Of special interest will be the fact that the book contains three chapters on the remembrances of three of our GAST members.

These books will be available for purchase (cash / check only) and signing, after the ceremony during the reception.

We hope that you will join us to celebrate 319 years of Germans in America, and to hear a powerful speech by our keynote speaker. Moreover, we will be royally entertained by our guest-orchestra from Germany with a delightful musical program.

In Germany a Schützenfest is a get-together of Jäger (hunters) and other marksmen in friendly competition to see who is the best "Schütze" (shooter). The winners are named "Schützenkönig" (shooting King) and "Schützenkönigin" (Shooting Queen). Members of the "Schützenvereine" (Shooting clubs) learn the art and sport of marksmanship with rifles, pistols or bow and arrows. The "Schützenfest" is usually combined with a Folkfest with fun for all and prizes for the best shooter.

At the GAST Schützenfest everyone was given the opportunity to try their marksmanship with a crossbow, bow and arrow or pistol (all made of plastic with suction cup tipped "bullets"). The weapon of choice was the pistol as members lined up to test their skills. Our new **Schützenkönig is Harry Runyon and the Schützenkönigin is Hannelore Giles.** Congratulation to both of you. As usual the Schnitzel-meal, prepared by **Ludger Schultz** was delicious. Please keep in mind that the portions provided by Ludger are dependent on the number of reservations made and include one serving of meat per person. It appears that a few persons must have taken a double serving because we cam up a little short. The party was attended by several guests from out of town including Mr. Joachim Wallenberg, president of the Oklahoma City German Heritage Society. Thank you all for making our event a fun evening.
