### The President's Report to the Membership

#### Greetings Members and friends,

It is that time of year again. We have heard the State of the Union message and the State of the State message. Here at GAST it is the time to take stock of the past year's progress, programs and activities, to look seriously at the financial condition of the Society and give you a State of the Society report.

First of all I would like to thank all of you have served as officers or directors in the past 23 years, as well as those who have served on committees. Without you as leaders GAST would not be where it is today. We are envied by those sister, German-American organizations who have had an opportunity to visit our GAST Center. Of course, I don't mean to leave out those of you who choose not to lead but serve the needs of the Society by participating in our activities. You are also a valuable asset.

During 2002 GAST was able to make monetary contributions to the German Language programs at Tulsa Community College and Tulsa University. We provided the funds for the Tulsa Public Schools to purchase equipment to enable them to continue broadcasting German language television programming. We contributed to the Tulsa Philharmonic to enable their special German night program.

The past year has been punctuated by continued progress, in implementing the ideas that developed from our "Think Tank" sessions. We have a renewed mission Statement. We have a Welcoming Committee to greet new members and extend personal invitations for them to attend social functions. We have a committee looking into restructuring the organization. We have a new monthly social function called Sontagskaffee that has proven quite popular as is the monthly Weinkellerabend. There is still more to be done.

The internal "groups", Choir, Folkdancers, Stammtischrunde, Lesegrupe, Handarbeit, Konversationsrunde, Speakers Bureau, Language Classes, Landscaping and Grounds Keepers, Building Lease Committee and Youth Group are always open to receiving more participants in their activities. More participation increases the effectiveness of the group
