The President's Report to the Membership

Dear Members,


I was very happy to see so many of you at the Special General Membership meeting on June 27. This shows me two very important things. First, that there are nearly 25% of the membership very interested in the future of GAST and second, a meeting is more enjoyable and you have better attendance if food is included.

The presentation given by the Re-organization Committee was well received and sparked a lively interchange of questions, thoughts and opinions. This is good. Before any intelligent decision on acceptance or rejection of this plan can be made there must be a thorough understanding. For the benefit of those who did not attend the meeting to hear the presentation I offer this background and a very brief summary.

This plan is the results of 9 months of work by the committee. This Committee was formed to research and develop a plan to accomplish another one of the many good ideas that immerged from the "Think Tank" of 2001, namely the reorganization of GAST. Several of the ideas that have already been implemented are having a working budget in place, an improved High School Youth Program, Weinkellerabend,, Sontagskaffee, the Welcome Committee and a Blasskapelle.

GAST is comprised of three corporations to fully satisfy the Oklahoma laws existing at the time they were formed. They are all non-profit organizations with different classifications under Oklahoma Statutes. <u>Under the proposed plan, none of this will be changed.</u> The changes will be only in the administration of GAST.

Legal Counsel for this plan was obtained. The reasons and goals for developing this proposal were the recommendation of the Membership (Think Tank), to streamline the Administration of GAST, allow GAST to be viewed as a single organization and to effect a more efficient Board. It will also streamline the financial procedures of the Society.



Under the proposal there would be one President responsible as the principal executive officer of the Society and exofficio Chair of the Board of Directors. The President would also serve simultaneously as the corporate President of GAST, GASAA and GASBC.

There would be one Executive Vice President to perform the duties of the President when same was not able or available or duties as assigned by the President and the management of the Society office. This Executive Vice President would also serve simultaneously as Corporate 1st Vice President of GAST, GASAA and GASBC.

There would be Four Senior Vice Presidents each responsible for a different area of GAST's activities. One Senior Vice President for Administration, one for Culture and Education, One for Facilities and one for Finance. The Senior Vice President of Finance would be responsible for the

Endowment Trust and would simultaneously serve as Corporate Treasurer of GAST, GASAA and GASBC. All of the committee chairs, those who "make it all happen", work through the various Senior Vice Presidents depending on the function of their committee. The Committee Chairs are the driving force of the Society.

The Secretary would be responsible for records and minutes as well as simultaneously be the Corporate Secretary for GAST, GASAA and GASBC. This proposal will provide cohesiveness between the corporate structure and the administrative structure.

There have been many changes in GAST since its inception almost 25 years ago. It has evolved from a primarily social organization to a combination social, cultural and business entity. We must change with the times or cease to grow.

The membership approved of this proposal by giving the committee a vote of confidence to continue with this proposal. The committee continues to work on the details of this proposal such as compiling policy and procedures and necessary by-law changes. Their goal for implementation is January 1 2004. If you have any questions please feel free to contact any member of the Committee or me. The Committee members are **Claus Greiner**, **Bill Leitch**, **Siegi Grimm**, **Jim Thomason and John Toschik**.

In other business of the GAST Board we are having to deal with problems that are not within our control such and the weather and the effects of the general economy on the country as it relates to our ability to raise funds to support GAST's activities. I have challenged the Board to find some new revenue streams. We can no longer depend on Oktoberfest and Mayfest to provide the majority of our income. There is a lot of public opinion that mistakenly






with the dancing chickens (thankfully) dancing only once during the evening.
