Dear GAST Members,



What a wonderful performance! Pianist Jura Margulis, born in St. Petersburg, Russia, has performed throughout Europe, the United States, Canada, South America, Japan and Russia. His pedagogical concept combines the Russian School's concentration on sound, imagination and physical technique with the German School's attention on structure, rhythmic coherence and style. This performance was the finale of a 3-day "Celebrate the Piano" program organized by the Barthelmes Conservatory and the Amadeus Piano Festival to introduce the piano teaching program at the Barthelmes Conservatory. 

GAST CHOIR TO ATTEND 2004 NATIONAL SÄNGERFEST

At the 2002 Cole Camp Sängerfest (choir festival) in Cole Camp, Missouri, the GAST Choir learned of the North American Singer's Association, an umbrella organization for German choirs nationwide. Subsequently our choir joined this group, which stages an annual National Sängerfest at various locations around the country. In 2004, the 58<sup>th</sup> National Sängerfest is being held in Peoria, Illinois in May.

Since Peoria is a considerable distance from Tulsa, this undertaking also will represent a considerable expense for food, lodging and transportation for those attending. To help minimize individual costs and allow most members to participate, the choir, with exceptional help from **Irmgard Toschik**, is organizing a fund-raising dinner for early November.
