Christkindlmarkt is the first weekend in December. It is chaired by **Darlene and Charles Tegeler** and is the second largest fund raiser that GAST conducts. This will be our 4<sup>th</sup> year and hopefully will continue to grow through the efforts of extended committee and all you volunteers. Anyone wishing to be involved is welcome to contact the Chair.

The Youth outreach of GAST is thriving under the Chairmanship of **Rusty Seelye**. Congratulations, Rusty, on the involvement you are creating between GAST and the German language students in Tulsa area high schools. See page 4 for his report. There are now over 1400 students enrolled in these German language classes. Attendance at Rusty's activities has grown so much that our existing video Display equipment is inadequate. GAST is looking for means to fund the purchase of some new Video Projection equipment for about \$3000. The General Membership meeting normally held during November has not been scheduled due to so many other activities during this period. We expect to schedule a General Membership meeting about the middle of January. At that time we will have a full

#### **Point**

"During recent membership meetings and articles in the ECHO, the Reorganization Committee presented a proposal to reorganize the management structure of the German American Society of Tulsa. I have given the proposal much thought and have come to the conclusion that I cannot support the changes advocated by the Reorganization Committee. I have been an active member of the German-American Society of Tulsa since its early years and was elected as President of the German-American Society Arts Association (GASAA) again in the year 2000 after an extended absence due to a job transfer. I am familiar with and have participated in most activities of GAST and know what it takes to run the organization.

The Arts Association was founded in 1981 to serve the educational and cultural needs of the membership and the community. It is financed entirely by contributions, which are tax deductible to the donor under the IRS provisions of a 501 (C) (3) corporation. GASAA programs include the German language classes, Kinderdeutsch, Konversationsrunde, Lesegruppe, the Speaker's Bureau, Adventsfeier and many musical programs. The officers of GASAA have regular contact with other area cultural organizations and have organized joined ventures with many of them.

Although none of that is supposed to change under the reorganization proposal, I cannot believe that it will be as effective with fewer <u>elected</u> officers dedicated to Arts. If anything, there is need for more people to be actively involved in the day-to-day activities of the organization. Elected officers and board members are committed to the goals of the Society and are accountable to the membership. The lively discussions during our board meetings are largely responsible for our success. I ask: Is efficiency of operation more important than diversity of opinion and settlement of differences in a democratic fashion?"

## **Counterpoint**

"This is to give the membership of GAST a short update about the status of the proposed changes to the organization of GAST.

We, the team, have almost completed the project. The president of GAST will call a membership meeting for Mid-or End of January to approve the by-laws changes of the organization. The Resolution for the by-laws will be sent to you <u>before</u> the meeting. The changes will only impact the GAST **organizations**, it will not impact the three 501-C **corporations**.

Since we realized that we still have members who might not see the improvements to GAST, I would just like to point out once more the impact to the Organization:

Currently we are working with three independent corporations. These corporations will not be impacted at all; they just will be under the one president. This will actually free up two active members for other projects. Another advantage: the president of GAST shouldn't be too much involved in the GAST organizations' daily business. This position should take care of the corporate activities including using finally our Endowment fund to generate a new Revenue flow

We still will have three VP's for the organization: for administration, for cultural and educational and for facilities. The functions like Language classes, Konversationsrunde, etc will still be handled by the same people. The Treasurer, the secretary and the board of directors have already been the same for years.

One very important point: operation of the GAST organization should be in the hands of the VP's and even more important in the hands of the committee chairpersons with their teams. These are people who really know the operation. They should have the responsibility for GAST.

### **TCC Teacher Position**

I am writing to ask your support and assistance to justify the need for a full-time German/French instructor at TCC. While this position is roughly 80% German and 20% French, it provides the major advocate for the German language at TCC. The full-time position which Barbara Taron left has not been filled. There is some talk of eliminating this TCC position entirely. While the Celle Sister city group still has Barbara's help, there is not a strong representative from TCC. Barbara Taron built up interest while she was at TCC, but that will soon dwindle if her position is not filled.

Letters from your organization to encourage TCC to fill the full-time German/French position may be beneficial These letters can be sent to Dr. John Kontogianes, Vice President for Academic Affairs, Tulsa Community College, 6111 E. Skelly Dr., Tulsa, OK 74135.

The letters might contain:

- -An indication of TCC's responsibility to the community because of the tremendous number of German activities in Tulsa;
- -Tulsa's large population with German heritage and the need to provide children with the opportunity to study German in college;
- -The Celle Sister City activities which warrants TCC's involvement;
- -The opportunity for student exchanges with Celle;
- -The fact that German is one of the three top languages studied at the college level;
- -Tulsa has companies that have a basis or are associated with German speaking countries;
- -The study of German helps English-speaking students with the study of English since both languages are derived from Old German;
- -The strong connection with German speaking countries and economic development in Oklahoma;
- -The fact that Germany is one of the big world powers;
- -Tulsa regional high schools have German programs which feed into TCC.
