

#### 11th Annual Folk Dance-Folklore

The North American Federation of German Folkdance Groups held their 11th Annual Folk Dance-Folklore Weekend in Tulsa, Oklahoma June 18-20. The German-American Society of Tulsa and the GAST Folk Dance Group were the hosts of this weekend of dance instruction that featured the Dances and Folklore of the "Heath District", "Lüneburger Heide".

The NAFGFDG president, Karin Gottier arranged for the instructor, Dr. Wolfgang Schlüter to come from Schacht-Audorf, Germany for the workshop. Dance instructions were given by Ingrid while the dance music was provide by Dr. Schlüter on the accordion and accompaniment on violin by his 11-year old son, Sören. Dr. Schlüter is a well known dancer and musician in Germany. He has been dancing for 35 years. His concentration is on the dances of Lower Germany and he has been instrumental in the re-publishing of older, out-of-print dance collections. He is also involved in teaching international folk dance and regularly attends workshops in other European countries. For 20 years, he has been involved in the research of Low German dances and music.

The 58 dancers from Folk Dance groups and as individuals who traveled from ten different states to attend the workshop were introduced to 11 dances from the "Heath District". They also had an opportunity to observe and participated in the Folkcrafts of Scherenschnitte and Bobbin Lace as demonstrated by members of GAST. I would like to thank Gabi Richardson, Ingrid Darnieder and Helga Roepel for sharing their talents with us. Thanks also to Irmgard Toschik and Gwen Bieber for preparing and serving refreshments and meals for the workshop participants.

On Saturday night, GAST members joined the Folk Dancers for an evening of fine German food, dance and camaraderie.

The GAST Folkdancers are now busy preparing for our fall program with practice sessions held on most Friday evenings in the GAST Weinkeller between 7 and 9 pm. If you are interested in joining the GAST Folkdance Group please contact the GAST message center at 744-6998, or call me at 299-2839.
