The event is organized by Tulsa Global Alliance (TGA) and is sponsored by Tulsa World, the Schusterman Foundation and area businesses. This year's theme was "Hello World". Very appropriate, because it gave young children and families an opportunity to experience many of the world's cultures on one field trip. Prior to the exhibition, TGA arranged teacher's workshops and encouraged exhibitors to prepare teacher's packages for distribution. 

Editor's notes...

My wife, Irene, and I had the pleasure to participate in a memorial ceremony for the mostly German prisoners of war who died while being held in Fort El Reno from 1943 till the end of the war. A total of 1,335 POWs were based in the Fort; 62 of whom died during in that time and were buried at the cemetery on the grounds.

The German-American Heritage Association of Oklahoma (GAHA) has arranged for a memorial service for several years now and members of



Harold Kamman blessed us with a short sermon and Ms. Ute Bear regaled us with "Im schönsten Wiesengrunde" and "Ave Maria" during the service.



We then walked over to the little cemetery, were three wreaths were laid in front of the tombstones while an American soldier played Taps. Two wreaths were placed in memory of the German POWs and, unexpectedly, one for the eight Italian POWs.

The beautiful little chapel you see in this report was built by the POWs.

Fellow GAST members, I urge you to make a note to attend this event next year—be sure to bring your tissues.
