Since this is our 25th Anniversary, it was recommended that we should take a "Group Picture" of the GAST Officers & Directors as well as of the Members participating in the Membership meeting. So, if you want to be in the picture, attend the membership meeting!

Our building will go through some major maintenance. It's used so much that it shows the wear and tear of the last few years. Since we are using it for many of our events and since it is also leased a lot, we need to keep it in top-notch shape. Leasing is one of our very good revenue streams. Except for the leasing-income of the Building Corporation, our property is strictly supported by GAST and its fundraisers, such as Oktoberfest, Germanfest, Christkindlmarkt, etc.

The Arts Association does their own fundraising for their functions but does not support the property.

Our big Parties are not fundraisers. Most of them are loosing money and need to be subsidized by GAST. They really are not structured to earn money otherwise the entry fee we are charging would have to be much higher. Expenses for the parties, especially for Bands and Catering have increased significantly. This does not mean we should discontinue our parties. They have always been an important part of GAST.

The Board has finally approved the budgets for 2005. It was a struggle. Since we are three independent corporations (by Law) we have to approve three budgets.

According to our by-laws, the German American Society Arts Association is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Every member of the German-American Society of Tulsa is also a member of the Arts Association. At the next annual General Membership Meeting on Sunday, April 10, our members will vote for a President, First and Second Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary for a 1-year term and 6 members of the Board of Directors for 2-year terms. The Arts Association holds monthly Board meetings on the second Wednesday of each month. Members are welcome at these meetings and may present questions or suggestions when recognized by the President at the meeting. When possible, questions or suggestions should be submitted in writing prior to the meeting.

The Arts Association operates with three standing committees, the Cultural & Educational Committee, the Public Affairs Committee and the Finance Committee. A fourth standing committee, the Nominating Committee is elected by the membership at the Annual General Membership Meeting.

I am writing this explanation of the structure of the German-American Society Arts Association to encourage more members to take an active part in the organization. The Arts Association is responsible for German Language classes, Kinderdeutsch, Deutsche Konversationsrunde, Speaker's Bureau, German Movie Night, the library, German-American Day and other staged cultural events at GAST and in the community. ARTS fully supports the Mission of the German American Society of Tulsa. **We need your ideas and volunteer help to be more effective.**

As of this writing we are still preparing for the Carson Wagner Concert on Sunday, February 20. I would like to thank **Jutta Tankersley** and her helpers for serving the refreshments and **Fred Rother**, **John Toschik** and **Doris Gallagher** for assisting with publicity, programs, setup and sound management. We are hoping for good weather and a huge turnout.

Thanks to good publicity by the Tulsa World and KWGS and our excellent teachers we had another record enrollment for the **Conversational German Language Classes.** We also have an enthusiastic group of kids enrolled in Kinderdeutsch on Saturday mornings.

Please mark your calendar for our annual garage sale, April 1-2. And for a performance by the visiting Swiss Yodelers "Echo vom Bodensee" at the GAST Center on Sunday, April 17 at 3 PM. The Elferrat entertained with their interpretation of a Men's Bell Choir.


