#### **Oktoberfest 2005 Update! A Success!**

We finally have all the bills paid and the income in place and we can declare Oktoberfest 2005 for GAST a success! The actual income from our sales in the food tents were \$52,549.01. The sale of remaining sausage, breads, etc brought in \$2,947.57 for total gross income of \$55,496.58. After all the bills were paid, we have a net income of \$24,335.40! NOT BAD! Thanks to a very hard working committee, we reduced our costs by about 6% this year. The efforts of Elam Blank were especially noticed in getting us a FREE refrigerated storage trailer from Grave's Menu Makers. We bought a good deal of our dry goods and other supplies from them and they took back all that we did not use! Elam also got all of our towels and aprons donated from United Linen Company. These helped us save several hundred dollars. THANKS ELAM!

The GAST Oktoberfest dinner and dance party even turned a profit! After all the expenses were paid [food supplies, baby sitter, band], we had a profit of \$368.40! This was because our Oktoberfest Committee cooked the meal in our own GAST kitchen! Last year the same meal was catered to us for \$1400.00. It was a lot work, but also a great deal of fun. THANK YOU COMMITTEE FOR PREPARING A GREAT QUALITY MEAL! Once again I say thanks to each of you who volunteered to work Oktoberfest in whatever capacity. It took all of us working together to make it happen. And that is the key to making future events successful and profitable. A GREAT JOB BY ALL!!

### **German Movie :**

CIRCLE CINEMA, 10 S. Lewis, will show the movie The Glamorous World of the Hotel Adlon on Saturday, January 28, 2006 at 2 PM.

The film is written and directed by Percy Adlon (1996) and is in German with English subtitles. It's the story about a young German-American Soldier, Louis Adlon, who is sent to **Berlin** after WWII by William Randolph Hearst as an overseas correspondent. Louis, who practically grew up in the hotel, is devastated when he finds the hotel burned down. His research into family history uncovers tales of love and scandal, of tragedy, debt and triumph, most of it gleamed from photographs and silent film footage. It brings to life the glamorous story of the grand hotel, with appearances by Josephine Baker, Thomas Mann, Charlie Chaplin and Marlene Dietrich. The showing is sponsored by the Tulsa-Celle Partnership.
