### **Directions to the Dizzy G. Ranch:**

É TX

South on Highway 75 to the Beggs (Highway 16) Exit. Exit **RIGHT** or **WEST** onto **Highway 16**. You will travel **7.5** miles to your next turn. (This puts you through Beggs, across two small creeks, (Checkerboard Creek and Tiger Creek). Immediately past Tiger Creek you will turn **SOUTH** or **LEFT** onto **Dentonville Road**. If you missed your turn you'll see a filling station and feed store to your left. Follow Dentonville Road for **4.8** miles. Turn **RIGHT** or **WEST** on to the first dirt road past all the curves called **Kennedy Road**. After 1 mile Kennedy Road makes a turn to the **LEFT** or **SOUTH**. The first place on your **LEFT** or **EAST** side of **Nuyaka Road** will be the **DIZZY G RANCH**.

## STROKE IDENTIFICATION

During a BBQ, a friend stumbled and took a little fall - she assured everyone that she was fine (they offered to call paramedics) and just tripped over a brick because of her new shoes. They got her cleaned up and got her a new plate of food - while she appeared a bit shaken up, she went about enjoying herself the rest of the afternoon.

Her husband called later, saying that his wife had been taken to the hospital and passed away. She had suffered a stroke at the BBQ. Had they known how to identify the signs of a stroke, perhaps she would be with us today. Some stroke victims don't die, they end up in a helpless, hopeless condition instead. It only takes a minute to read this. A neurologist says that if he can get to a stroke victim within three hours he can totally reverse the effects of a stroke . . . totally. He said the trick was having a stroke recognized, diagnosed and then getting the patient medically cared for within three hours, which is tough. Thank God for the sense to remember these steps. Read and Learn! Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke. Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

- Ask the individual to SMILE.
- Ask the person to TALK, to SPEAK A SIMPLE SEN-TENCE. (Coherently) (i.e. It is sunny out today.
- Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS. NOTE: Another 'sign' of a stroke is this:
- Ask the person to 'stick' out the tongue. If the tongue is 'crooked', if it goes to one side or the other, that is also an indication of a stroke.

If he or she has trouble with any one of these tasks, call 911 immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher. A cardiologist says if everyone, who gets this information forwards it to ten people, you can bet, at least one life will be saved.

## Sophie Scholl - Die letzten Tage

A German nominee for Best Foreign Film at the Academy Awards in 2005



This film details the last six days of the primary members of a resistance group called the White Rose. The White Rose was an organization of students, mainly around Munich, during the years 1942-1943. There were also fringe elements that eluded capture by the authorities, some member of which survived until the end of the war. Many of those survivors contributed to this story.

Two other films about the group were produced. The main one was a film called "The White Rose". It recounts the complete story of the group. The other was Fünf Letzte Tage (The five last days), which deals with Sophie's last five days. Both of these movies were released in 1982 and the same

actress (Lena Stolze) plays Sophie Scholl.

This current film is an amalgamation of these two films with some expansion to the story and therefore contains more details than the original two films.
