German-American Day will be celebrated at 3 PM on Sunday, October 8 in the Great Hall. This year's speaker will be OSU History Professor emeritus and author of "Wanderers Between Two Worlds", Dr. Douglas Hale. His subject will be the adventures of seven young men who were involved in the movement for unification of the German people in the early 19th century. When it was crushed by the authorities, they escaped to the United States and settled in what was then the American West. Here they established careers of political, scientific and cultural distinction. Oklahoma Jazz Hall of Fame's Chuck Cissel will provide the musical portion of the program.

We are seeking volunteers to help setup and staff our booth at the Kid's World program in November. 

- Volunteers are needed to get their food handlers card. It requires a class and test which take approximately one hour. You may sign up by calling the **Health Department at 582-9355.**






