Our building is not only our biggest asset but our biggest fund raiser for the Club. In 2006, we leased the main hall for 37 paid events. Our gross receipts from these events totaled approximately \$45,000. We furnish security with active, off-duty Tulsa Police Department officers. Members of our leasing committee host each leased event to provide services to our guests and building.

Another source of revenue to our club comes from renting our parking lot. The US Post Office pays a monthly fee so employees and customers may use our spaces.

Oktoberfest 2006 Summary

I want to first thank all of you who volunteered to help us at Oktoberfest. With your help it was successful. Without the help of each volunteer, we could not have done the amount of work we did. Thanks to all. I also want to thank the steering committee for a job well done. Those on the committee that worked very closely with me are Erica Hartman, Elam Blank, Charles Tegeler, Jim Walker, Ed Westenhiser, Dave Schonewies and Lois Voeller.

Here is a general summary of the festival to give you an idea of what it costs us to do this festival. Income from Oktoberfest = \$54,593.57. Admission to the Oktoberfest party = \$1265.00 – for total income of \$55,585.57.

Expenses [just some of the major costs]

Sausages \$7,087.10; Buns \$2,212.45; Kraut \$1,120.00; other food stuff [potato pancake mix, applesauce, BBQ, etc \$5,971.93

Refrigerated Truck - \$791.50, Propane - \$139.29, Hired labor [movers, dish washers] - \$1513.04 Tent rental: \$2640.00, GAST Sponsorship: \$3500.00, Use of GAST building for poster party: \$1000.00 [in kind donation to Oktoberfest] Volunteer pins: \$698.79, Storage Unit rental: \$385.00, Volunteer Shuttle Van: \$756.35; GAST Oktoberfest party expense: \$1672.89 [includes \$895.00 for the band.]

These bigger expenses along with numerous other costs leave us with approx. \$25,249.43 as 'take home' money from Oktoberfest. The committee felt it would be beneficial for everyone to see what it costs us to run our 2 food tents at Oktoberfest. The addition of hot dogs at the EssZelt was a big success. We sold many more than we anticipated. This caused several trips to Sam's to buy more!

The Committee will look at our operation and make suggestions for next year in an effort to make it easier and more profitable. As I turn the chairmanship over to someone else, I again thank all members who worked so hard with me for the last 2 years.


