This particular painting, however, is owned by the National Cowboy Museum and is currently on loan to the Schirn Kunsthalle Museum in Frankfurt, Germany. It has only been loaned out once before, and that was to the Smithsonian.

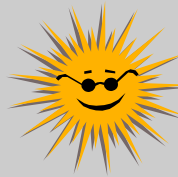
Our building is in use nearly every day of the year. **Lois Voeller** reports that at this time we have 28 leases for 2007 and one for 2008.

Funniest Male Winnie the Pooh: Jay Porter

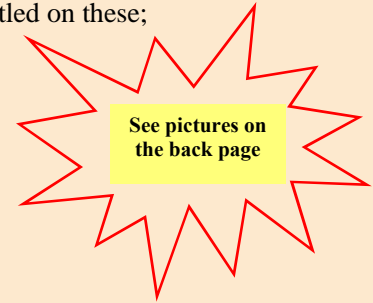
Funniest Couple Uncle Remus and Aunt Jemima Don and Carol Wright
