This year's speaker will be Reinhard Förster, President of the Deutsch-Amerikanische Gesellschaft in Celle, Tulsa's Sister City in Germany.

Mr. Förster had a long career as a manager for the City of Celle and in that capacity he was instrumental in establishing the sister city relationship between our cities. He organized multiple cultural and educational exchanges for our benefit. Remember the musical groups that came from Celle to perform for us during previous German-American Day celebrations?

Most recently Mr. Förster arranged home-stays for several GAST members during the Sister City Conference in September 2007. And it was his initiative that resulted in an student exchange between Bishop Kelley High School and Ernestinum Gymnasium as well as a planned exchange between Bixby and Jenks German language high school students and Hölty Gymnasium in Celle. We are very honored to have him speak to us at this event.

The musical entertainment will be provided by the Covenant Brass Quintet with a rendition of classical, jazz and popular favorites.

Kinderdeutsch began on September 8. We have 15 students, which is a good turnout. We may get a few more as the sessions continue. Adult language classes are also under way. We had approximately 48 persons register at the opening night in addition to those who pre registered. Enrollment was down slightly from last semester. We were able to fit all of the beginning students into a single class.

The musical variety program by the American Theater Organ Society will have occurred by the time this is published. We are expecting a large audience. Details will be reported next month.

Our annual German-American Day celebration will take place in the Great Hall at 3 PM on Sunday, October 7. Mr. Reinhard Foerster, recently retired city official of Tulsa's German Sister City, Celle, and current President of Celle's German-American Society will be guest speaker. His topic will be "Celle's Partnership Relation with Tulsa". Tulsa's own "Covenant Brass Quintet" will furnish the musical entertainment. A reception follows the event.

The Arts Association is coordinating the annual Volkstrauertag (German Memorial Day) ceremony at Fort Reno, OK. This event commemorates German and also Italian soldiers who died while interned in

Oklahoma during WWII. The event begins at 2 PM on Sunday, November 18 at the Ft. Reno Chapel, which was constructed by German prisoners of war. Mr. Dick Warner will speak of Oklahoma's wartime internment camps. Participants will include the Honorary Consul General, the Governor's Honor Guard and a delegation from the German troop contingent at Fort Sill.

Ceremonies conclude with laying of the wreaths at the post cemetery. Fort Reno is located two miles north of Exit 119 off Interstate 40 approximately 30 miles west of Oklahoma City. We will organize a carpool of interested members to attend the event. This will also serve as the November Konversationsrunde.

Adventsfeier will be celebrated at 3 PM Sunday, December 9. We will again welcome a pastor from Celle. More to follow next month.

All Arts Association events are free and open to the public. Come enjoy them— and remember to bring a friend.
