

The Arts Association is coordinating the annual Volkstrauertag (German Memorial Day) ceremony at Fort Reno, OK. This event commemorates German and also Italian soldiers who died while interned in Oklahoma during WWII. The event begins at 2 PM on Sunday, November 15 at the Ft. Reno Chapel, which was constructed by German prisoners of war. Charles Wiggin, Honorary German Consul and Colonel Robert Powell (Ret.) will speak during the ceremony. Participants will also include: the Governor's Honor Guard and a delegation from the German troop contingent at Fort Sill. Ceremonies conclude with laying of the wreaths at the post cemetery, accompanied by GAST members **David Marshall and Max Tankersley** playing the bagpipes. Fort Reno is located two miles north of Exit 119 off Interstate 40 approximately 30 miles west of Oklahoma City. We will organize a carpool of interested members to attend the event.

German-American Day





In 1983 President Ronald Reagan proclaimed October 6th as German-American Day to celebrate and honor the 300th anniversary of German American immigration and culture to the United States. On August 6, 1987, Congress approved S.J. Resolution 108, designating October 6, 1987 as German-American Day. It became Public Law 100-104 when President Reagan signed it on August 18. A proclamation (#5719) to this effect was issued October 2, 1987 by President Reagan in a formal ceremony in the White House Rose Garden, at which time the President called on Americans to observe the Day with appropriate ceremonies and activities.

Accordingly, the German-American Society of Tulsa (GAST) continues to celebrate this holiday this year on Sunday, October 4th. (the Sunday nearest to the actual date). The ceremonies will commence at 3 PM in the Great Hall of the GAST Center, located on 15th Street, one block west of Lewis. This event is free and open to the public. Donations to defray costs are welcome.
