
volunteers to help make this another successful event for us and the community.

As an outreach of GAST, we dance at nursing homes, weddings, parties, churches, schools – if we are asked, we will gladly go. Our



### **Kinderdeutsch begins February 6th**


The younger a child starts learning another language, the easier it is for them to excel not only in the new language they are learning but also in their daily language. Students of foreign languages excel academically over their non-foreign language counterparts. What better way to enhance your child's (or grandchild's) learning career than by enrolling them in a fun, educational program which will teach them German language and culture with song and dance.

Children from Kindergarten through 6<sup>th</sup> grade can benefit from these classes. Our spring session begins on February 6th from 10 to 11:30 am and will run for 8 sessions, with a break for Spring Break (March 20), ending just before Easter on April 3 and culminating with our Easter party on that day. Cost for children or grandchildren of members is \$20 (that's \$1.67 an hr), non-members -\$25. A \$5 discount is given for each additional child within a given family unit.

You do not need to remain at GAST while your child is having their lessons. There are abundant shopping opportunities near-by. We ask only that you can be reached by cell-phone and that you return in time to pick up your child. If you choose to socialize with other parents, coffee will be available and you may want to bring some nibbles.
