The next meeting will be at 3 pm on the 14th of March at the Gilcrease Museum located at 1400 North Gilcrease Museum Road (596-2700). Please gather in the entrance 10-15 minutes prior to the tour. At this time Gilcrease has a special exhibit by Charles M. Russell and Olaf Seltzer. This exhibit is a famous collection of paintings and sculptures by two world renown artists. 

Sure looks like fun, doesn't it?















In February 1945, barely three months before the end of World War II, the city of Dresden was heavily bombed. Approximately 25,000 people were killed. The picture on the left shows the remnants of the iconic Frauenkirche after the raids. The new Frauenkirche was reconstructed over a period of seven years by architects using 3D computer technology to analyse the old photographs and every piece of rubble that had been kept The church was formally consecrated on 30 October 2005. GAST contributed to its reconstruction.
