Lieder, is the German word for 'songs' and so this concert is one of German songs presented by Oklahoma native Andrea Hanson. Ms. Hanson lived in Europe for twenty years, performing in many of Europe's major opera houses, including those in Munich, Dresden, and Florence. She has sung over 80 roles in opera, operetta, and musical theater and has concert repertoire of over 60 major oratorios, masses, and cantatas in countries such as Italy, France, Spain, Germany, Denmark, the Netherlands, and Austria. She was Associate Professor of Music at Carnegie. After that very distinguished career she returned to Oklahoma City where she continues to make and teach music with her students and fellow musicians. These are some of the songs Ms. Hanson will be singing for us.


