This event commemorates German and also Italian soldiers who died while interned in Oklahoma during WWII.



The Arts Association is again coordinating the annual Volkstrauertag (German Memorial Day) ceremony at Fort Reno, OK. This event commemorates German and also Italian soldiers who died while interned in prisoner-of-war camps in Oklahoma during WWII. The event begins at 2 PM on Sunday, November 14 at the Ft. Reno Chapel, which was constructed by German prisoners of war. Charles Wiggin, Honorary German Consul and Dr. Bill Corbett will speak during the

ceremony. Participants will also include: the Governor's Honor Guard and a delegation from the German troop contingent at Fort Sill. Ceremonies conclude with laying of the wreaths at the post cemetery, accompanied by GAST members David Marshall and Max Tankersley playing the bagpipes.

Fort Reno is located two miles north of Exit 119 off Interstate 40 approximately 30 miles west of Oklahoma City. We will organize a carpool of interested members to attend the event.

We hope that many GAST members will have an opportunity to attend this very moving event. Please call **Arnold Bieber** at 357–9156 if you wish to sign up to join or to provide for car pooling.

If you have never attended one of these ceremonies, it is a moving experience with music and solemn commemorance, as the honor guard lays wreaths to those who gave their lives. We will car pool from the GAST CENTER on Sun. Nov. 14th and plan to leave the parking lot at 11:00 A.M.. After the commemoration, most people congregate for a delicious German meal at the **Bavarian Inn** before returning to Tulsa.


