

GAST Names New Band Director

Lisa Lahmeyer has been selected to serve as codirector of the GAST Blaskapelle Band, filling the position formerly held by Shawn Usedom, who was recently transferred to California by his employer. Lahmeyer will share director duties with David Law-

rence who is now completing his second year as co-director.

Lahmeyer received a degree in Music Education from Oklahoma State University with study emphasis in both voice and instrumental music. She currently serves as instructor in the 7th and 8th grade choral program with the Jenks Public Schools. Previous to her Jenks employment, she taught 8 years at Tulsa's Webster High School in both the choral and band programs. She is also the founder of the Spotlight Brass, a private musical group active in the local area.

The Blaskapelle Band was formed

11 years ago with an initial membership of 4; today, the band has 25 active players. The band is primarily a German Band, playing the old German favorites; however, the band also plays a variety of American music including patriotic, big band, and popular American tunes. The band plays for a number of GAST events throughout the year, and also schedules public appearances by invitation before various public audiences. All band earnings for outside public appearances are returned to the GAST general



operating fund.
