MEMBER INTERVIEW:

Erica Hartman

You and Neil have been married how long? 56 years. We were married in Linz, Austria, in 1956.

Any family? Oh, yes! Three married children, two grandchildren, and two great grand children, fortunately all living in the Tulsa area, except our granddaughter who is married to a serviceman stationed at Fort Bragg, NC.

What is your background, and Neil's? I'm a metallurgist. I worked for several oil companies and also for Heat Exchanger Manufacturing here in the U.S. In Europe, I worked for the European Exchange System. After Neil retired from the U.S. Army he completed his education as an aeronautical engineer. He has a passion for flying, which is one of the reasons we settled in Tulsa. Neil made me learn how to fly so I would loose the fear of the unknown, and also so I could fly the airplane if something would happen to him when we are up in the air.

You're Austrian? Yes, I am an only child and come from a small family. My Dad died when I was 7 years old. He had been in the Dachau concentration camp. All of my relatives still are in Austria.

What about Neil? He's from Scranton, Pennsylvania. His great grandfather was from the Netherlands and entered through Staten Island.

Do you speak German privately? Both Neil and I do speak German. And our children do as well, thanks to my mother—they spent full summers with her in Austria and they were forced to learn German and to speak it as she spoke very little English.

Do you read in German or watch German movies? I read very little in English or German, but I enjoy the German-language movies at GAST Movie Night. I recommend that very highly.

You've been a GAST member how long? A long time—I joined GAST at their second meeting. I just felt that I needed to belong to a German-speaking group and help keep up some of the culture and traditions.

You're an indefatigable volunteer. When I get involved in something I give 100%. I do get overwhelmed at times but when someone says the dinner was good or I see people enjoying the food and festivals—and GAST benefits—that is reward enough for me.

GERMAN EXCHANGE STUDENT SEEKS HOST FAMILY

Bob Behrent lives with his family in Klötze, Germany... about 40 miles East of Celle. His father, Carsten, is a linguist/interpreter by vocation... typically translating documents in and out of German, English, Czech and Russian... or serving as an interpreter. He also serves as a city councilor and plays on Klötze's volleyball team. His mother, Andrea, is a teacher... primarily middleschool ethics, music & German in the Klötze school system. He has a sister, Rica, who is 12 years old.

Bob attends an accelerated school, plays soccer, plays the violin and has a weakness for video games. Carsten & Bob have completed the 450-mile Oklahoma FreeWheel bicycle ride, and the entire family has hiked to the top of Pike's Peak and into the Grand Canyon. Last month, Bob scored

"Excellent" on the English standardized exam for prospective exchange students.

Bob mentioned his interest in becoming an exchange student when he & I first met in Klötze, during my second trip there in 2010. His first trip to America was in 07/2011, when the Behrend family visited us in Tulsa. Carsten & Bob returned once since (for FreeWheel 2012). During that visit, Bob, Carsten & I met with one of the principals at Jenks School and were given a tour of their facilities.

My wife & I have explained to Bob and his folks that we would be pleased to work toward Bob's becoming an exchange student in Tulsa. I also explained my desire that my wife and I not serve as Bob's primary host family... I am 63 yrs old/young, and Bob's interests would be better served by his living with a host family having a schoolaged student of similar age. My wife & I would like to serve as Bob's secondary home, as we think quite highly of him & his family. I also think his having a primary & secondary home here would alleviate a number of concerns. He would be welcome to stay with us days, nights, weekends and weeks if such would allow his primary host family peace of mind, and private times and travels. We also carry the confidence of his parents, should medical or legal decisions need to be discussed and made.


