...from the Arts President — Gertrud Schmidt

Es war einmal.... Once upon a time.... All of the Grimms fairytales begin thus. It was 200 years ago December 20, 1812 that the Grimm brothers Jacob (1785-1863) and Wilhelm (1786-1859) published a collection of fairytales with the title: "Kinder- und Hausmärchen". They had travelled through many German states to collect these tales. While initially not a best seller it has since been translated in just about every living language and sold over a billion copies. The Grimm brothers primary concern was to save the many - mostly orally transmitted- stories and at the same time save the German





language which, after the Napoleonic wars and occupation by the French was in danger of being adulterated and lost. They were scholars of the German language and started work on a thorough dictionary of the language which was finished 123 years later; they were writers, librarians, University professors and politicians.

It therefore seemed timely and appropriate that the theme for this year's German Essay Contest was "The Brothers Grimm influence on American Children". While many students referred to the Disney Version of the tales, others experienced the fairytales through story- telling by parents or siblings and reading of the original children's versions. **Barbara Conrad**, **Arnold Bieber** and **Gertrud Schmidt** judged 47 essays submitted by students studying German in Tulsa schools and selected and ranked what they considered the three best essays. The students and their parents will be honored guests at the GAST Anniversary celebration on January 19, 2013

DORIS GALLAGHER

You are native German, are you not? Yes. Berlin is my home town even though I did spend some time in Erfurt, in the Erzgebirge and Naumburg a/Saale during the war years. I have visited all those areas since then and try to get back to "the old country" every two years or so - even though "lying is no longer what it once was.

And how did you come to the U.S., and end up in Tulsa? I came to the United States with another university student after the Berlin Blockade as two of the first German exchange students after WW II. I came to Tulsa in 1950 after one year as an exchange student in Raleigh, N.C. where the publisher family of The Tribune sponsored my five years of education. I lived with the Richard Lloyd Jones, Jr. family, who has the Riverside Airport named after him. Otherwise, I have lived in New York, Anchorage, Connecticut and Miami, FL. In the States besides overseas in Karachi, Pakistan; Frankfurt and Berlin; and Rome, Italy.

So you went to school here? Yes, I did. I graduated from Tulsa Central H.S., attended T.U. for two years and graduated from the University of Colorado. After that I flew for Pan American World Airways for three and a half years; then taught English in Alaska; worked for "The Tulsa Tribune" after my return for eight years and after that was the administrative assistant for the president of a German medical subsidiary (Lohmann) in Broken Arrow.

What about your husband? He is American born and—I had met him in Karachi, Pakistan on one of my lay-overs where he was Pan Am Operation Manager at the time and I was a Purser for the airline.

You are divorced now? Yes. After 22 years of marriage, my husband and I decided to go our separate ways. While

he continued several more overseas assignments. I returned to Tulsa where I had grown up. We have two daughters, one married with three daughters who live in San Antonio; the other is a German professor at a private university in Orange, CA.

So I am guessing you and your entire family are fluent in German. / still speak German and I also tutor in German as well as English. Both my daughters and all three granddaughters are bi-lingual. I subscribe to "German Life" and "German World"; I watch German films through "Netflix". I like reading biographies in either language.

Do you attend Movie Night here at GAST? I would love to but it interferes with other activities.

How long have you been a GAST member? Let me see . . . I joined

GAST in 1985. I have served on the Board and as a GAST German

Language teacher at various intervals; as a GAST office manager after Christl Harms moved to Missouri. I co-chaired the first and second annual "Christkindlmarkt"; I chaired the media publicity for ten years. I volunteered at "Germanfest" and "Oktoberfest" for many years – but as I grow older it becomes a bit harder. I hope the younger generation can take over for us.

What recommendation would you offer for improving GAST? The same thing Leon Boggs stresses again and again: the younger generation should bring about the changes which they see appropriate in order to keep the organization active, friendly and attractive for the next generation as well.

Do you see yourself retiring to Germany? While I like visiting my native country as long as I am physically able to, I believe I would rather continue to live in the United States because it has been good to me.

What is a little-known fact about you, Doris, that other members—perhaps even your closest friends—would be surprised to learn?

Well, not many of my friends know that I have been privileged to meet three American presidents: Harry Truman in the Oval Office in Washington shortly after I first arrived in the U.S.; Richard Nixon in New York at a Newspaper Advertisement Association Banquet—when he was Vice-President and Dwight Eisenhower on his State visit to Pakistan.
