vendors. It is reported that all vendor space is taken! Again, please be ready to help with this event as it too helps us raise much needed funds.



Harvest Moon and Fall Equinox, the harbingers of fall are upon us. The days are getting shorter, the evenings and nights proportionately longer – it is a good time to stock up on good

books and music and fill your spare time with more indoor activities. That is exactly what seven eager young students are planning to do. For the next eight weeks they will exercise their gray matter by learning to speak and write German with the help of their charming teacher Angelique Giddings. After sitting still for almost an hour, the students are ready to get some action. That's where Kathleen and Jeff Mosburg come in. They are volunteering to teach the children some rhythmic dances such as the "Shoemaker Dance", challenging their muscle power and tune up their vocal cords with favorite German folksongs. They will show off their talents at the Tulsa Oktoberfest... so come, see and hear! After these mental and physical exercises the students are ready for some cookies and juice for which they say 'bitte' and 'danke' very nicely and then watch some German language cartoons. A fun filled morning for all.

Ruth Obermark has put together a great team of teachers for the adult German language classes. Sindy Andrews, Angela Novak, Doris Gallagher, Carol Masters, Grete McNaq and Katie Sloan started the classes on September 17, 2013. Beginner, intermediate and advanced German Language classes attracted 60 students who for the next ten weeks will either be taking baby steps in a foreign language or perfecting what they already know. As more and more schools are dropping German language classes from their curriculum in favor of French, Spanish and Chinese, it will be up to organizations such as GAST to fill the void.

German American Day is being celebrated for the 30th time on October 6th since it was instituted by President Ronald Reagan in 1983 to honor the contributions of German immigrants. It was 1683 when thirteen German families arrived in Pennsylvania and founded Germantown. Names such as v. Humboldt, Steuben, Boeing, Mann, Einstein, von Braun are easily recognized as German and their contributions are well known. Or - closer to home - go visit the Gilcrease Museum and you will see art work by Emanuel Leutze whose painting 'Washington Crossing the Delaware' hangs in the Capitol in Washington D.C., Alfred Bierstadt, Carl Schreyvogel, Carl Wimar, Rudolf Cronau and more.

GAST will celebrate German American Day on Sunday October 6th at 3:00 pm in the GAST Center Great Hall. The GAST Blaskapelle will play the anthems of Germany and

the US and entertain the audience with some selected pieces. Speaker Dirk Heindorff from Tulsa's German sister city Celle will talk about his experiences with Tulsa, Odessa, Missouri, and New York in connection with Celle and certainly will be available for questions and answers. MCs for the event will be Barbara Conrad 2nd VP for ARTS and Arnold Bieber, Chair of the Education and Cultural Committee, assisted by hostesses Mary Jane Mueller, Joanne Sieber and Ginny Rohr.

On Sunday, October 13th, at 3 PM, the Arts Association will host a performance by the visiting Celle Fire Blaskapelle in our Great Hall. The 20-member brass band from our sister city in Germany will entertain you in style. Everything from traditional marches and polkas to popular music will be played by this group of volunteer firemen and women whose hobby is music (when they are not fighting fires). The event is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be served by our charming hostesses, and you will have a chance to meet our visitors.

Upon my return from Germany I will tell you all you ever wanted to know about Oktoberfest in Munich.


From the GAST Library

Oktoberfest Wash Party at the GAST Center at 8:00am Saturday morning to assemble, wash, dry and organize all of the equipment, utensils and supplies needed for

GAST's operations at Oktoberfest.

The larger equipment, including grills, steam tables and other equipment is stored in the garage next to the GAST hall. Everything has to be hauled out, checked and tested to be sure all is in working order, then cleaned and bagged for its destination at the fairgrounds, either the larger Biergarten tent or the smaller Esszelt. Veterans like Arnold Bieber, Erica Hartman, and Leon Boggs have been doing this for so many years they have it down to a science.

In the GAST kitchen, all of the utensils, pots and pans and smaller items used during the festival are also washed thoroughly, then bagged for the appropriate tent to which they will be delivered. Once cleaned and ready to go, the equipment is returned to the garage ready to load onto the moving trucks the Sunday before the festival.


