

...from the GAST President — Arnold Bieber

Celebrating Maifest (Mayfest) has a long tradition in German cities and villages. It usually involves decorating and erecting a "Maibaum" (May tree), colorful parades and the coronation of a Maikönigin (May Queen). It is a celebration of spring, the greening of gardens and meadows, new life, lots of flowers. Young men, especially enjoy the competition, the chance to court the fairer sex, and sometimes they will invade another village to cut down and steal their Maibaum, which can result in some fist fights when they get caught.

Tulsa already had an annual Mayfest when the German American Society of Tulsa was formed. So it was a natural for GAST to participate, which we did for many years. Just like Oktoberfest, it involved getting volunteers to bring in and set up equipment at a designated site, schlepping supplies and then finding a

place to park. So, in 2004, when there was construction everywhere in downtown Tulsa, and the future on Mayfest that year was in question, the GAST Board decided that we would have our own festival, in our building, on our site, and we would call it **GERMANFEST.** This will be our 12th year of Germanfest, and it will be bigger and better than ever. More activities, more entertainment, more fun! That means we need more volunteers. I hope you have answered the call, and you will be there to help us make this important cultural contribution to the community and fundraiser for the organization more successful. And don't forget to shop the Laden for that unusual Mothers or Fathers Day gift!

We recently had some complaints from members who have not received their monthly ECHO newsletters. I checked into this with our Membership Chair, Tom Bordner, and Paul Greek who maintains our membership database to determine what our current procedure is. They told me that all members who have paid their dues by March 1st should continue to receive their newsletter, either by mail or electronically, as they have specified. If a member misses the deadline, he/she will be added back to the database when the dues are received. The March 1st deadline also establishes the eligibility to vote at the General Membership Meeting and/or to be nominated for office. It is very important that the Membership Chair is notified of any changes of address, telephone numbers and e-mail addresses. When a mailed ECHO is returned to us, we pay first class postage to get the change of address information that may or may not be on file at the Post Office. Our ECHO editor, David Forbes, usually sends an e-mail broadcast message to those members that have specified the electronic version of the ECHO. However, it is always available on the internet by keying http://membership.gastulsa.org and clicking on "Das Deutsche Echo". That website has a lot of other interesting information about GAST that you might also like to review. Please let us know if you do not get your ECHO in a timely fashion. Be patient, though, sometimes the snail mail takes a little longer.

The results of the General Membership Meeting and Elections on Sunday, April 26, will be published in the June ECHO.



I would like to thank all the volunteers who helped me to make our Garage Sale so successful. It would not been possible without the time and effort you gave us.


