

The meteorologists are in agreement. It was the dampest May in Oklahoma's recorded weather history. Storm after storm rumbled through Tulsa but – fortunately- sparing us from the

worst. Certainly I was not the only one welcoming the first sunny days of June and hoping for it to stay that way until fall. But umbrellas and galoshes had a short stay in the closet.

So what did you do on those dreary wet days when gardening, walking the dog or just strolling along the river meant challenging Thor – the old Germanic God of thunder and lightning. I read a lot. The newspapers and journals were full of stories of anniversaries. There was D day – the horrible battle on the shores of Normandy. On May 7, 1945 – seventy years ago- General Eisenhower accepted the unconditional surrender of Germany in Rheims by the German General Jodl. That officially ended World War II for Germany on May 8, 1945. At peace ever since, Germany's military has acted as support to the Western Allies- including in Afghanistan and Iraq. On September 2, 1945 Emperor Hirohito signed the surrender of Japan on the deck of the battleship

Missouri. Just as Germany, Japan has been at peace since that historically important day. Going back 200 years on April 1, 1815 Otto von Bismarck (shown, right) was born in Schoenhausen/ Saxonia. Surely everyone has heard the name Bismarck. Maybe they do not know that as Chancellor to Emperor William I, he is credited with unifying the 17 German States. Even though he created a Health and Accident -insurance and Old Age pension system for

the working class, he defended the monarchy and was vehemently opposed to a Democracy of and for the people. Understandable, since he belonged to the class of Nobles. The many statues, names of places, streets, lakes, islands, mountains and even a city in North Dakota speak of the high esteem Otto von Bismarck was- and to a limited extent- is still held in Germany and abroad. Have you ever tasted a 'Bismarck Hering'? A trader of Stralsund got permission to use this name for a fish dish – a herring-specialty of this town. So much for name recognition!

Compared to 200 years and 70 years GAST is a relative

newcomer to the 2015 anniversaries. Its articles of incorporation were signed January 22, 1980. We did celebrate this anniversary with an Anniversary Ball on January 17, 2015. So here we are, 35 years later still upholding our Mission: "Preserve and promote the German language, culture, traditions and customs through educational and social events for the enrichment of its members and the community". GAST ARTS- which was incorporated one year later- diligently works on this mission.

The American Theater Organ Society will treat us to a concert on August 21, 2015 at 7:00pm in the Great Hall of our GAST House. Language classes for adults start up on Tuesday September 8, 2015 at 7:00pm and Kinderdeutsch on Saturday September 12, 2015 at 10:00am. Our wonderful GAST Blaskapelle will play for us on German American Day October 4, 2015 at 3:00pm. Members of GAST will again honor the German soldiers and the Fallen of all wars at a ceremony at Ft. Reno November 15, 2015 at 2:00pm. On December 13, 2015 the annual Advent Service will be held in the Great Hall of our GAST House.

GAST Member Jack Wynn Receives Award

Long-time GAST member Jack Wynn was awarded Congressional Gold Medal during the Oklahoma Wing Conference held April 25 at the Sequoya State Wagner, Park Lodge near Oklahoma. The medal was awarded to the Civil Air Patrol and its members to honor their service during World War II. Wynn was only Oklahoma member receiving the award.

The Civil Air Patrol, under the Office of Civil Defense at the outset of the war and later under the War Department, had a critical role in providing anti-sabotage flights, anti-submarine patrols on the nation's coasts, border patrol flights, search and rescue missions, and training pilots for the fledgling Army Air Force.

Wynn, who was 16 at the time of the outbreak of war, worked for his uncle at a small airport in Crete,

Nebraska, doing miscellaneous work, washing planes, mowing grass and at the same time learning to fly. He became a Civil Air Patrol cadet and performed the service for which he was later recognized. He later joined the Army Air Corps and served for 2 years from October 28, 1943, to October 28, 1945.

Wynn has been a member of GAST since the mid-1980's and married to his wife Jenny for 63 years this July 19.
