

"Oh come all ye members"! To the membership meeting on April 24, 2016 at 3:00pm at the GAST House. It's the time when you need to choose who will lead the German American Society of

Tulsa (GAST) and GAST ARTS (GASAA) organizations during the next year(s). The By-Laws state that no officer shall hold the same office for more than five consecutive years. This means that my term as president of the German American Society of Tulsa ARTS Association is up as of May 31, 2016. The old adage 'time flies when you are having fun' certainly applies to my stint at the helm of GASAA as its president.

One of the most important function of this position is to act as a linchpin to GAST from which it is separated only by tax laws – membership and mission are identical, directors, secretary and treasurer are shared but 1st and 2nd Vice-presidents are unique to GAST and GASAA. GERMAN CHANCELLOR REELS FROM RECENT ELECTION LOSSES

Angela Merkel was stunned by a series of election losses on Sunday, March 13, that could easily be one of the most serious challenges she has faced to her power since her election as German Chancellor in 2005. The elections held were held on what the German press dubbed "Super Sunday" in regional parliaments in three of the country's federal states: those in Baden-Wurttemberg, Rhineland-Palatinate, and Saxony-Anhalt.

But the ongoing refugee crisis in Europe, for which the Chancellor has taken a position not entirely in harmony with popular sentiment in Germany, meant that the votes in the three parliaments were seen as a virtual referendum on Mrs Merkel's controversial "open-door" refugee policy.

The results could seriously undermine and weaken the German chancellor as she tries to persuade other EU leaders, perhaps particularly Britain's David Cameron, to agree to a deal with Turkey to resolve the migrant crisis.

Mrs Merkel's Christian Democrat party (CDU) was defeated in its stronghold of Baden-Württemberg for the first time in more than 50 years, according to exit polls. In the western state of Rhineland-Palatinate, it saw a lead of 10 per cent in the polls evaporate in just four months. Most damaging of all for Mrs Merkel, the Alternative for Germany (*Alternative für Deutschland* or AfD) a right-wing populist and Eurosceptic political party founded in 2013, stormed to its best election results ever on a campaign that focused almost exclusively on an opposition, anti-migrant message.

Even in the East German state of Saxony-Anhalt, where the CDU managed to hold its tenuous grip on first place, celebrations were muted as the AfD secured a shocking second place with 24 per cent of the vote, *die Linke* coming in third with the *Social Democratic Party of Germany* 4th, losing half its strength to the AfD.

The AfD won seats in all three state parliaments and emerged from the night as a political force Mrs. Merkel can no longer afford to ignore.

Who Am I?

A German born revolutionary, American statesman and reformer, and Union Army General in the American Civil War. He was also an accomplished journalist, newspaper editor and orator, who in 1869, became the first German-American elected to the United States Senate. He was U.S. Minister to Spain, and at one time, Secretary of the Interior. His wife, Margarethe, was instrumental in establishing the kindergarten system in the United States. During his later years, he was perhaps the most prominent independent in American politics, noted for his lofty principles, avoidance of political partisanship, and his strong moral conscience. Many streets, schools, and parks in the U.S. are named after him, including one in New York City. *Reply to davidalanforbes@gmail.com*
