





---from the Arts President — Arnold Bieber

It's *déjà vu* all over again. I have the strong sensation that I have been in this position before. It must be true. Many years have passed since I finished my last term as ARTS President. John Millar took the reins after me, followed by Jim Randall, Uschi Mueller and, for the last 5 years, Gertrud Schmidt. I want to thank them

all for keeping the cultural and charitable programs of ARTS going for the last 10+ years.

Now I would like to review and reiterate the purpose and objectives of the German American Society Arts Association.(usually referred to as GASAA or ARTS). The GASAA was founded in 1981 and was recognized by the IRS as a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation. That designation allows donations to ARTS to be deducted from taxable income for eligible individuals and corporations. The German American Society of Tulsa, founded in 1980, on the other hand is a 501(c)(4) corporation. The distinction is clear. 501(c)(3)organizations are considered charitable organizations, 501(c)(4) are social welfare organizations. Both are notprofit corporations organized to benefit their members and the community with their specific missions, but donations to GAST are not deductible according to the IRS rules Our by-laws stipulate that members of GAST are also members of GASAA, although a very small amount of the membership dues are donated by GAST to GASAA.

GAST and GASAA activities have been reviewed by a non-profit lawyer prior to the transfer of assets of the German American Society Building Corporation (GASBC), and he determined that both GAST and GASAA meet the requirements of their IRS designations.

As stated in the GASAA by-laws, the Association was organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes. We meet these objectives by donating leftover serviceable items from the annual garage sale to the Salvation Army or Goodwill and sending donations collected at the Adventsfeier to Meals on Wheels. The educational aspect is covered by our semi-annual Kinderdeutsch and Adult Conversational German Language programs.

The adult language programs have been particularly successful. As local public high schools are eliminating German from their curriculum, we expect that the need

for teaching the German language will increase.

Serving with me on the Board of GASAA are Charles Meyers Jr., 1st Vice President; Gabriele Gonzales, 2nd Vice-President; Donna Boggs, Secretary; Janet Jamison, Treasurer. Additional Board members are Joe Rohr, Carol Wright, Tonja Carrig, David Lawrence, Roberto Martinez, Ursula Mueller, Cheryl Baker, David Gonzales, Bill Wilber and Harold Wicks. Chair of the Cultural & Educational Committee is Gertrud Schmidt. Cheryl Baker is Chair of the Publicity Committee. What a team! I am grateful for their support.

Cole Camp

Cole Camp is a small town (population 1121) in central Missouri with a rich German immigration history. The first German settlers arrived in the 1830s, mostly from the Kingdom of Hannover which is now the state of Lower Saxony (Niedersachsen). German immigration continued throughout the rest of the 19th century. Growing families, shortage of farm land and political strife in the homeland were the dominant reasons for the immigration.

The new settlers brought with them strong Christian beliefs and their native tongue, Plattdüütsche (Low German) which is still spoken today by some families, although the public use of the German language and dialects was discouraged during, and the years immediately following, World Wars I and II.

The Plattdüütscher Vereen (Low German Club) was established in 1990 to revive the Mudderspraak (mother tongue). To that end they formed a Low German Theatre group and several choirs. The first Cole Camp Sängerfest was held in 1992. Invitations were sent to several German-American Clubs and Singing Societies to join the experience and camaraderie of singing the old and some newer German folk songs. Current president of the Plattdüütscher Vereen, Neil Heimsoth, has been the driving force behind all of these efforts.

The German American Society of Tulsa GAST Sänger were late-comers to these annual events, but they attended many of them in the years that National Sängerfests were not held.

This year, Cole Camp celebrated its 25th Annual Sängerfest on Saturday, June 11, in conjunction with an Immigrant Memorial Dedication. The memorial honors the brave souls who left the German-speaking areas of Europe to make new homes in central

Missouri. The Cole Camp Plattdüütscher Vereen invited the GAST Blaskapelle to play the National Anthems for the official ceremony.

Members of the GAST Sänger and Blaskapelle left Tulsa at 7 AM by bus to make the 5 hour trip to Cole Camp. Arriving at noon gave us a chance to stretch our legs and adjust to the heat and humidity, drinking plenty of water. The dedication ceremony began at 2 PM with a welcome by Neil Heimsoth, playing of the National Anthems by the GAST Blaskapelle, Invocation by Rev. Sandy Schlesselman and greetings by the Mayor of Cole Camp, a state representative and a state senator. The guest speaker was Dr. Joachim Reppmann, formerly of St. Olaf College in Minnesota.

The Sängerfest started at 3 PM with choirs from Cole Camp, Kansas City, St. Louis and Tulsa participating. A special

treat was the performance of the Cole Camp Braun Family Kinderchoir. All singers joined for "Dankeschön und auf Wiedersehn" and "America the Beautiful" at the end of a great day.
