

### ---from the Arts President — Arnold Bieber

The German American Society Arts Association Endowment Trust was established in April 2000 for the purpose of furthering the charitable and educational goals and the maintenance of the facilities of the German American Society organizations. It was assigned the non-profit status 501 (C)(3) by the IRS (TIN 73-1589995). The Trust was initially funded by a major contribution from the Barthelmes Foundation. Since then the Trust has grown substantially by additional contributions and earnings. Annual distributions of dividends earned by the Trust to the Arts Association have financed a number of cultural and maintenance projects of the Societies. None of the funds are used for the benefit of the trustees and members. All trustees, as well as the officers and directors of GAST and GASAA are unpaid volunteers. A full report of the financial status of

the Trust will be made available at the Membership meeting on Sunday, April 23.

Our organizations owe a full measure of gratitude to the vision and generosity of Dr. Albert Barthelmes and his wife Hedwig (Hete), which made it possible to acquire and renovate this beautiful building in the early 90s.

Albert ("Doc") and Hete left Germany in the 1930s. Upon arriving in Tulsa, then known as "the Oil Capital of the World", Dr. Barthelmes became a highly successful and innovative petroleum engineer specializing in seismic exploration. Although they never had children, they supported the musical education of young people throughout their lifetime. The Barthelmes Conservatory continues that tradition, and the Barthelmes Foundation has supported the Tulsa Philharmonic Orchestra (now Tulsa Symphony) and many other non-profit organizations. GASAA could not continue to operate without the generous donations from our members and the Barthelmes Foundation.

About 50 people came to attend the reception given by GASAA and the Tulsa-Celle Partnership and to see the award -winning, Oscar-nominated German film "Toni Erdmann" on February 17 at the Circle Cinema. Another Oscar-nominated movie "Land of Mine" from Denmark will show on March 31. It tells the story of young German POWs forced to dig up land mines planted by the German Army who expected an invasion on the Danish coast.

The TCC Metro Campus Global Fest on February 21 gave us and the Tulsa-Celle Partnership an opportunity to

display German cultural items and show 2 videos of "Germany from above". Thank you, Jutta Tankersley, Barbara Taron, Ursula Andress and Gabriele Blankenship for your help and Barbara Conrad for some of the display items.

We have been approached by an organization called GroupRaise to organize dinner meetings where a portion of the sales will be donated to us. The Board approved our participation and we selected Jason's Deli on 61<sup>st</sup> & Memorial as the restaurant. Details are still being worked out as I write this column. They will be announced by email and Facebook.

Don't forget the General Membership Meeting and Election of Officers and Directors on Sunday, April 23. We need a quorum to proceed with the meeting.
