
Summer is here and with that we have many of our members vacationing throughout our country and the world. We wish them safe travels on their journeys.

SWOSU Professor Looking for Narratives of Individuals Who May Have Aided Oklahoma's German Farmers

Professor David Hertzel, of Southwestern Oklahoma State University in Weatherford is looking for stories about individuals who went out of their way or risked trouble to help any of the German farmers who were unjustly persecuted in Oklahoma in the early twentieth century.

In a missive to Arnold Bieber, he indicated that he is particularly interested in first-hand accounts, preferably narrated by those (or the descendants of those) who were helped. He is hoping to find accounts of people who came from outside the German American (or Mennonite and Amish) communities who helped persecuted groups, during times of violence or oppression against German Americans. And he is particularly interested in descriptions of people who risked something--their safety or reputation, perhaps—in order to help some unjustly persecuted individuals or people, and has greater interest in family memories of such people than of hard documentation.

Anyone having any such experience or information or having family members who do or who know of anyone with such information may communicate with Professor Hertzel at Southwestern Oklahoma State University, Weatherford, Oklahoma, through email if possible, to davidhertzel@swosu.edu.
