Our future as an organization and the success of our mission – to promote and preserve the German language, culture, traditions and customs – depends on our efforts to engage and involve the young people of the community. We cannot offer trips to Germany, but we can invite them to our events and offer programs of specific interest to young people. GAST is now sponsoring a soccer team that

promotes our organization. It is no secret that soccer (Fußball) is the national sport of Germany, but it is not necessarily linked to Germany in the minds of those who play soccer or watch soccer games. It is our job to communicate that connection.

When most local high schools offered German language classes, we had many opportunities to invite the teachers and students to our events and we even created special events for them. However, financial cutbacks have eliminated most public school German language programs. Currently only Riverfield and Cascia Hall continue with their German language programs at the elementary and high school level in Tulsa. Jenks Public School reinstated some German classes recently, and they are still available at the Southeast Campus of TCC and at Tulsa University.


ARTS briefly considered filling the gap by adding an evening course for high school age students. We thought we could fill a need, but realized that we cannot duplicate what the high schools were offering at no additional cost during the day. Our Adult Conversational German classes are highly successful, but Kinderdeutsch enrollment is at minimum level. GAST needs a dedicated Youth Chair to support the efforts of the schools that are still teaching the German language. It is our best hope to continue as a strong ethnic heritage organization.

ARTS will participate in "The World in a Box Day" on Saturday, August 5, 11 AM to 3 PM, at the Central Library, 5th Street and Denver. The title refers to the cultural boxes that Tulsa Global Alliance and Eisenhower International School maintain which contain unique items from 40 countries. The Library expects 200-250 children to attend.

For a great evening of pleasant entertainment please come to the annual joint meeting of the Sooner State Chapter of the American Theatre Organ Society (ATOS) and GAST Blaskapelle on Friday, August 18, at 7 PM. The event is free and open to the public. Invite your friends and family. And mark your calendar for the Swiss Concert on September 29 and German-American Day on October 8.



Kinderdeutsch Classes Start September 9th

On Saturday, September 9th, the Kinderdeutsch program starts it's fall session. The children's program takes place on Saturday mornings from 10-11:30am and is open to children ages 4-12. If you

The 10-week program costs \$50 for non-members, \$40 for members, with a \$5 discount for each additional child from the same family. Classes start with age appropriate German language lessons, followed by folk dancing and folk songs. Then they are treated to cookies while watching German videos.
