

German-American Day at the GAST Event Center 2301 E. 15th Street Sunday, October 7, 3 PM

Please join us to celebrate German-American Day. first proclaimed as an annual holiday by President Ronald Reagan on the 300th Anniversary of the date in 1683 when 13 German families from Krefeld landed in Philadelphia. These families subsequently founded Germantown, Pennsylvania, the first German settlement in the original thirteen American colonies.

German immigration continued through colonial times and increased during most of the 19th century due to religious and political persecution, wars and the lack of arable land to feed growing families in Germany. New waves of Germans arrived after WW1 and WW2.

German-American Day honors German-Americans who excelled in the fields of science, business, politics and arts.

Dr. John te Velde is a Professor of Foreign Languages and Literatures at Oklahoma State University. Professor te Velde was the recipient of an Oklahoma Humanities grant to support his research on heritage Germans in Oklahoma who still today maintain aspects of German culture.


The central thesis of Dr. te Velde's research is that settlers of Oklahoma whose common bond was German culture brought with them a unique resilience that enabled them to preserve important aspects of their culture and to pass along their cultural heritage to future generations. Their strengths enabled them to make notable contributions, despite making up just over 3% of the population in the early settlement years. His presentation will include recordings of Plautdietsch as spoken today by descendants of Germans from Russia.
