The multi-player game is simple to learn but requires more strategy than chance to win. Although dice throws control the distribution of resources,

players develop their own path by spending their resources on roads, settlements and cities. The games generally take 40 minutes to an hour, but the fact that there is no fixed game board means that a unique strategy to win is required every time the game is played.

Regular card decks will also be available, as some people have expressed an interest in playing Canasta or other card games.
