ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING


The annual election of Officers and Directors will be held at the GAST Center

Recommended Safe Use Guidelines



Stay Distant

Try to keep a distance of at least six feet from other people.



Wash Hands

This simple thing is seen by many medical professionals as one of the most important things. Take your time and wash your hands as often as possible.

DIOS Craft Beer Night Friday, July 17th





American Solera Brewery - July 17th, located at 1702 E 6th St

Prost! will pick up where we left off by visiting American Solera Brewery on 7/17/2020. American Solera specializes in creative craft beers that have aged 6–18 months in oak barrels. Currently, they have 16 beers on tap, plus wine and cider.

In 2016, RateBeer named American Solera the 2nd Best New Brewery in the world and the Best New Brewery in the United States. If their address sounds vaguely familiar, it should! Last summer, American Solera moved into the old 14,000 square foot Bendmaster building in Tulsa's Kendall Whittier neighborhood, just steps away from Cabin Boys Brewery and Marshall's Brewing Company. As for food, 1907 BBQ food truck will be parked outside and the brewery plans to offer some snacks for sale as well. **FYI – Bring your credit card. Cash is not accepted at this time.**

August 21st – Elgin Park Brewery (New Destination), 325 E Brady St, located near ONEOK field, is a brewery and a pizza joint. There are 6 house-brewed drafts to choose from as well as a selection of other local beers. Thincrust pizza appears to be their specialty, so we won't leave hungry.

September 18th - Pearl Beach Brewpub, 418 S Peoria, is a beach volleyball bar with an onsite brewery and taproom. There's plenty of patio seating, an onsite brewery and a cozy taproom. Sobre Mesa Food Truck will be on hand serving Latin-inspired food.
